Employment of Workers with Disabilities

Description of the issue or dispute [200 words]:

Workers with disabilities have trouble finding and keeping jobs.

Detail of the campaign or strategy [100 words]:

Campaigns in the media and negotiations with the government.

On June 25, 2014, the Histadrut signed an agreement, which was expanded by means of an extension order for the entire private sector, which states that employers with over 100 employees will be required to properly represent people with disabilities at a rate of 3% of all workers. It was also agreed that the employer must appoint a representative on his behalf who would be responsible for the employment of people with disabilities and to promote their appropriate representation for optimal integration in the workplace.





Furthermore, the Histadrut signed an historic agreement on 29.9.17 which improves the situation of 244,000 people with disabilities in Israel, via an addition to the pension in a number of stages and additional benefits, all within an annual budgetary framework that will reach NIS 4.2 billion (approximately \$1,153,846,154) in 2021.
